TRY PRAYING

A couple of years ago, a poll found that nearly half of adults in the UK say that they have prayed at some point in their lives, and over a quarter said they had prayed in the last month. The stats also show that younger people (under age of 34) are more likely to pray than older people.

These numbers are surprising because they are way higher than the numbers

who go to church, and also higher than the number of people who believe in a God. It suggests to me that praying is something that many people try and connect to, more so than other forms of religious practice. It also resonates with my own experience of speaking to people who are not sure about their beliefs but have faced situations in their life where they have prayed anyway, reaching out in the hope that there is someone, beyond themselves, that can help. Prayer has been a part of human activity across time and across cultures, but there are also many in our own communities who struggle with the idea of prayer and are not too sure where to start.

The 'trypraying' booklet is a short guide to prayer written primarily for people who aren't religious. It contains stories of people who pray, ideas of things to do, and discusses themes about honest prayers and how to connect with God. Copies of the booklet are available from our churches and we hope that they will be widely circulated across the parish.
